The company is listed on the <u>Tokyo Stock Exchange</u>, is constituent of the <u>Nikkei 225 stock</u> <u>index<sup>[4]</sup></u> and provides its products through its subsidiaries in Asia, Europe, and North America.<sup>[5]</sup> Mitsumi is primarily known as a <u>OEM</u> manufacturer of computer peripherals and input devices, <u>Floppy</u> and <u>optical disc</u> drives used in <u>laptop</u> computers, <u>desktops</u>, <u>servers</u> and the <u>Famicom Disk</u> <u>System</u>. On January 27, 2017, <u>Minebea</u> merged with Mitsumi to form MinebeaMitsumi.<sup>[6]</sup>
