


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### **Product Feature Map**

Figure 2: Drive Current vs. Voltage (T<sub>sp</sub>=25°C)





Figure 3: Typical Relative Luminous Flux vs. Drive Current (T<sub>sp</sub>=25°C)

Figure 4: Typical Relative Flux vs. Solder Point Temperature





Figure 5: Typical ccx Shift vs. Solder Point Temperature







Figure 7: Typical Spatial Radiation Pattern at 50mA, T<sub>sp</sub>=25°C



Figure 9: Typical Color Spectrum




Figure 10: Drawing for SMD 2835








Figure 13: Emitter Reel Drawings

Figure 14: Emitter Tape Drawings


